2024 Call for Juried Papers

Deadline: March 25, 2024

Notification of acceptance: Week of May 13, 2024

This call for Juried Papers seeks original contributions, including reports of research, theory, pedagogy, best practices, thought pieces, and critical essays related to library and information science.

While it is encouraged to connect your paper to this year's theme; The Ethics and Evolution of Truth and Information, proposals that fit outside of this theme will still be reviewed for acceptance.

Professional competencies as outlined in the conference theme show the importance of shared skills and knowledge that students need in order to thrive in information settings. Competencies exist in a variety of contexts including national, international, disciplinary, and specialized settings. The conference theme of bridging the gap encourages us to evaluate current competencies, consider new competencies, and examine how we as educators are integrating different professional competencies in our courses and programs to best prepare our students.

The goals of this theme are to renew and strengthen the connections between teaching, learning, and practice.

Submission Requirements and Instructions:

All submissions must be entered via the ALISE 2024 submission system, EasyChair.

Select the appropriate track: Juried Papers

Proposal Submission Guidelines:

- Length: The Juried Paper should be 2000-2500 words in length, excluding references.
- Any tables, figures, or other graphics should be embedded in the document.
- Keywords: Authors should provide two types of keywords.
 - (1) ALISE Research Taxonomy Topics: Authors should assign 3-5 keywords from the ALISE Research Taxonomy (<https://www.alise.org/research-taxonomy->)
 - (2) Author Keywords: Authors should choose appropriate keywords (3-5 keywords) for their papers. Do not replicate keywords that were already listed from the ALISE Research Taxonomy.
- Peer Review: The Juried Papers will undergo a double-blind peer review. Please remove all identifying information from the paper and abstract. Accepted paper-writers will be given an opportunity to submit final drafts of their proposals with identifying information.

Evaluation Criteria:

Abstracts will be evaluated by the Juried Paper Committee according to the following criteria:

To encourage more research papers or panel proposals, ALISE welcomes submissions beyond the conference theme. Submissions will not be reviewed based on the conference theme.

1. Relevance to current and emerging issues in LIS education
2. Originality of ideas
3. Potential impact/significance
4. Select references to relevant literature
5. Overall quality of writing

Presentation at the Annual Conference

Authors whose proposals/papers/posters/panels are accepted for the annual conference are required to register for (fees apply), attend, and present the work at the ALISE annual conference. Failure to do so will result in removal of the papers/posters/panels from the conference schedule, the program, and the proceedings. Should the event be converted to a virtual conference, the same policy applies.

Conference presentation dates and times will be published online and in the conference program.
