

ALISE Annual Conference Academy 2019 Call for Proposals

We are seeking proposals for the 2019 ALISE Academy that address the conference theme, "Exploring Learning in a Global Information Context," The ALISE Academy is a half-day interactive workshop which will take place from 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Monday September 23, 2019. The successful proposal will focus on some aspect of the conference theme, supporting LIS educators worldwide. The format can vary but often entails a kickoff presentation by one or more workshop leaders, followed by small group activities, discussions, and large group wrap-up. Innovative interactive formats encouraged.

- Bridging international divides with new pedagogy methods and fresh perspectives
- Challenges for distance learning
- Creating a welcoming climate for women and under-represented groups
- Cross-cultural challenges and opportunities

- Epistemological standpoints in LIS education
- Innovations in virtual and traditional classrooms
- International collaboration in LIS education
- Pedagogical approaches for global learning
- The defense of academic freedom and free speech

Evaluation Criteria

- Quality of the submission
- Qualifications of the workshop leaders
- Relevance to conference theme
- International representation among workshop leaders is also encouraged

Submission Requirements/Instructions

All submissions must be entered via the ALISE 2019 submission system at https://easychair.org/conferences/?conf=alise2019. First-time users will be required to

register and create an account. Select the relevant track for your submission: ALISE 2019. Designate the type of submission (Juried Paper, Juried Panel, SIG Submission, Works in Progress Poster, Doctoral Student Poster, **Academy Proposal**).

Your proposal, linked to the conference theme, should include the following (1,000 words):

- Address for correspondence
- First and last (family) name of all workshop leaders (authors)
- Email address for all workshop leaders (authors)
- Phone number for all workshop leaders (authors)
- Institution/organization name of each workshop leader (author)
- Workshop objectives
- Workshop format
- Outcomes for participants
- Connection to conference theme

Select submit once all data has been entered into the submission form.
