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ABOUT THIS REPORT

This report presents an overview of the current state of library and information science education in the US and Canada and highlights several notable trends the data exhibit over time. ALISE annually collects data from its institutional members in these categories: faculty and staff, students, curriculum, and income and expenditures.


The data upon which this narrative report is based were collected in fall 2023. 59 schools contributed data to this year's report.








Figure III-1: Areas of Concentration / Career Pathways in ALA-Accredited Degree(s)



Figure III-2: Curriculum: Degree Prerequisites ALA




Figure III-3: Curriculum: Course Delivery Method(s): ALA




Figure III-4: Curriculum: Online Course Delivery ALA




Figure III-5: Curriculum: Summer Course Offerings ALA




Figure III-6: Curriculum: Degree requirements ALA


